Al-Anon Membership Survey Is Open Now!



Participation in Al-Anon surveys by all members, regardless of length of membership in the program, level of involvement in service work, or any other factor, is of the utmost importance in helping to develop and evaluate programs that will strengthen and grow the Al-Anon Family Groups.

Involvement in Al-Anon surveys is also considered service work and is greatly valued as we seek to reach out to those who are dealing with the effects of someone else's alcoholism but haven't yet found help in Al-Anon. Survey results are used in communicating with professionals who are in a position to refer patients and clients to Al-Anon. Results of surveys are also used to improve communication with the membership.

From time to time, the WSO is also approached by outside researchers who are requesting assistance in their research on friends and families of alcoholics. The WSO Policy Committee approved a procedure for determining whether Al-Anon cooperation in researchers' projects will benefit Al-Anon. The policy ensures that our cooperation with researchers complies fully with Al-Anon's Traditions Six (non-endorsement of outside enterprises), Eleven (public relations based on attraction rather than promotion), and Twelve (protection of anonymity). The Survey Is:

- Conducted every three years since 1985.
- Open from June 16, 2021 to July 27, 2021.
- Available to all Al–Anon members, ages 18+ years—regardless of time in the program.
- Available in English, Spanish, and French.
- Short enough to be taken in 15 minutes.
- Mobile–friendly.

The Survey Is Not:

- Collecting personal information.
- Breaking members' anonymity.

Here are some interesting facts about one of the first Al-Anon pamphlets published as Conference Approved Literature (CAL) in 1961...

•The pamphlet was originally a booklet developed by Harold Black, a non-member, with the participation of members of the Prestonsburg, Kentucky Al–Anon group in 1953.

•The Clearing House (Al-Anon's first World Service Office) distributed this pre-CAL version until 1961.

•In July 1961, when groups received a summary of the first World Service Conference, they also received copies of the first two pieces

designated as Conference Approved Literature: *Alcoholism, the Family Disease* (P-4) and *The Twelve Steps and Traditions* (P-17).

- The new version of Alcoholism, the Family Disease (P-4) was "a happy merger from the Literature Committee" that combined new material developed by the Literature Committee with the title and some sections from the Kentucky group, and additional content from the Triple A Family Groups booklet from Arizona.
- When first printed, the "Three Obstacles to Success in AI-Anon" was titled, "Three Enemies of AI-Anon."
- The pamphlet was revised in 2005 to include an adult child's story that had been removed from *Al-Anon Sharings from Adult Children* (P-47) when that pamphlet was revised.

- Help plan and host the MAIS anniversary celebration
